Parsha Of The Week

"See," says Moses to the people of Israel, "I place before you today a blessing and acurse"—the blessing that will come when they fulfill G-d's commandments, and the curse if they abandon them. These should be proclaimed on Mount Gerizim and Mount Ebal when the people cross over into the Holy Land.

A Temple should be established in "the place that G-d will choose to make dwell His name there," where the people should bring their sacrifices to Him; it is forbidden to make offerings to G-d in any other place. It is permitted to slaughter animals elsewhere, not as a sacrifice but to eat their meat; the blood (which in the Temple is poured upon the altar), however, may not be eaten.

A false prophet, or one who entices others to worship idols, should be put to death; an idolatrous city must be destroyed. The identifying signs for kosheranimals and fish, and the list of non-kosher birds (first given in Leviticus 11), arerepeated.

A tenth of all produce is to be eaten in Jerusalem, or else exchanged for moneywith which food is purchased and eaten there. On certain years this tithe is given to the poor instead. Firstborn cattle and sheep are to be offered in the Temple, and their meat eaten by the *kohanim* (priests).

The mitzvah of charity obligates a Jew to aid a needy fellow with a gift or loan. On the Sabbatical year (occurring every seventh year), all loans are to be forgiven. All indentured servants are to be set free after six years of service.

Our Parshah concludes with the laws of the three pilgrimage festivals— Passover, Shavuot and Sukkot—when all should go to "see and be seen" before G-d in the Holy Temple.

In the past the Lulavim have been imported from Egypt. There have been complaints about poor quality and there were issues due to the political situation. To avoid these problems, this year all will be beautiful Mehudar high quality Deri Lulavim from Jewish farms in Israel with Badatz hashgacha on every Lulav. Due to the increased cost, the price this year must be slightly higher than last year. However our price, including deluxe quality Esrogim, is comparable to what retail stores charge for these same Lulavim alone without the Esrog.

Kosher Korner

- Magnum bars (sold in area specialty shops and kosher stores) produced in Germany and Italy are kosher only when a Kof-K is printed on the label. Magnum bars without any Kof-K symbol on the wrapper are not kosher.
- Magnum bars (sold in area specialty shops and kosher stores) produced in Israel by the Strauss Company are certified kosher by the Rabbanut only if the Strauss copyright logo (a very small set of stars) is printed on the label. All other Magnum bars even if labeled "Made in Israel" are not kosher.
- Some packages of both the Probiotic Yogurt Mix and the Yogurt Raisins produced by Nutty Naturals (Brooklyn, NY) were mistakenly labeled with the OK Kosher symbol instead of the OK-D. These products are dairy. These products are being withdrawn from the market. If you see these products in a store, please contact the OK at 718-756 -7500 or info@ok.org.
- Sophia Pomegranate Juice bears an unauthorized OU symbol. This product is sold in dollar stores and discount stores (e.g. Big Lot) around town.
- MacKnight Smokehouse Salmon Mignon seen in Whole Foods Market and some kosher shops bears an unauthorized KOF-K PARVE. This product is not certified by the Kof-K.

Young Israel national Council Go Green Campaign



Young Israel Launches "Project Go Green" To Help Israeli Soldiers
The National Council of Young Israel has launched Project Go Green
to help Israeli combat soldiers get the special tzitzit they require.
NCYI joined forces with American Friends of the IDF Rabbinate to
promote a special tzitzit shirt made from a new fabric (Dri Fit) that
resists perspiration and is able to withstand the rigors of the field.
The tzitzit garment (beged) worn by combat soldiers in the Israeli
army must be olive green to match their uniform camouflage in the
field. The standard-issue green tzitzit is made of thin cotton that does
not last long under the extreme rigors of long weeks of field training

and combat.

The Young Israel's new initiative enables people to provide these tzitzit to Israeli combat soldiers. A donation of \$25 for 1, or \$36 for 2, will help NCYI and American Friends of the IDF Rabbinate reach their goal of supplying 10,000 sets of tzitzit to Israeli soldiers by Rosh Hashanah.

Project Go Green is a unique opportunity to add a layer of protection to our beloved chayalim, while at the same time helping them fulfill a mitzvah as they are defending their country.

In light of the current debate regarding the Israeli army service of Orthodox Jews, it is important to recognize that the army is extremely mindful of the religious needs of its soldiers. For example, if a soldier wants tzitzit, he is provided tzitzit.

The American Friends of the IDF Rabbinate, in collaboration with the National Council of Young Israel, has been working to give the IDF Rabbinate the extra capability to ensure that Israeli soldiers are able to serve their country, while at the same time being able to maintain their religious observance. Among their many areas of activity, in addition to tzitzit, they provide tefillin and tallitot, Torah libraries, and, for combat units in the field, a field aron kodesh and a field beit knesset kit.
