Dvar Torah by Rabbi Yaacov Marmor

Parshas Tazria discusses the halachos of the Metzora and how he is diagnosed by the Kohen to determine if he is indeed afflicted by the miraculous disease of tzaraas. Many commentators clarify that this was not a natural ailment, but rather a divine indication that the afflicted individual must do teshuva to rectify a spiritual malady.

A clear indication of this understanding is that the afflicted individual could only become a Metzora if he was proclaimed so by the Kohen. Even if everyone was certain it was tzaraas, as long as the individual did not visit the Kohen, he would remain pure.

The final step in the purification process was for the Metzora to bring a korban in the Bais Hamikdash. But the nature of this Korban was not standardized. Much like tuition in our Jewish Day Schools, it depended on the financial wherewithal of the Metzora.

If he was a person of means, he would bring a Korban that consisted of two male lambs, one female lamb, three tenths of an eifah of fine flour mixed with oil, and one log of olive oil. This was a pretty hefty Korban, but was an absolute obligation for one who wished to become cleansed of tzaraas.

However, if the Metzora was poor and could not afford the above Korban, he would bring much less: one male lamb, one tenth of an eiphah of fine flour mixed with oil, a log of olive oil, and two turtle doves. You see, Jewish Day Schools did not invent this concept!

The Chafetz Chaim learns a very important lesson from this halacha. Sometimes a person performs mitzvos, does chessed, and learns Torah, but he knows that he is performing way below his actual potential. However, instead of pushing himself harder, he looks at those around him and says "Hey, compared to Yankel, Meir, and Dovid, I'm doing pretty good. They only learn 2 hours a day and I am learning 3! They are only giving \$100 to tzedakah and I am giving \$180! I guess I'm doing great!"

But the truth is, this is not the way Hashem sees it. Each individual has their own unique kochos, their own unique gifts, and their own unique abilities. Hashem judges each person based on their own unique potential, and does not compare them to anyone else.

This lesson is taught to us by the korban of the Metzora. If a rich person were to bring a Korban slightly superior to the poor man's korban (but less than what is expected of him), he would not be yotzai. The korban would be invalid! There is a concrete expectation for the wealthy individual, and just because he brings more than the poor man does not mean that he is fulfilling his obligation.

By the same token, the poor man should never feel ashamed of his smaller korban. This is what Hashem has endowed him with, and he is dutifully fulfilling his obligation. He should feel proud of his Korban! This is why it is not only unhealthy to compare ourselves to others, it is actually foolish.

Each person is given their own unique potential, and that is the only yardstick against which they are judged. Therefore, the only question we must ask ourselves is "are we living up to our potential?" If not, we must work harder, regardless of the spiritual standing of those around us.

May we always judge ourselves against ourselves and never look at others for our spiritual validation.
