

G-d instructs Moses to command Aaron and his sons regarding their duties and rights as *kohanim* ("priests") who offer the *korbanot* (animal and meal offerings) in the Sanctuary. The fire on the altar must be kept burning at all times. In it are burned the wholly consumed ascending offering; veins of fat from the peace, sin and guilt offerings; and the "handful" separated from the meal offering.

The *kohanim* eat the meat of the sin and guilt offerings, and the remainder of the meal offering. The peace offering is eaten by the one who brought it, except for specified portions given to the *kohen*. The holy meat of the offerings must be eaten by ritually pure persons, in their designated holy place and within their specified time.

Aaron and his sons remain within the Sanctuary compound for seven days, during which Moses initiates them into the priesthood.

**HAFTORAH SUMMARY****JERERMIAH 7:21-28; 9:22-23**

This week's *Haftorah* touches on the subject of sacrifices, the main topic of the week's Torah portion.

G-d tells the prophet Jeremiah to rebuke the Jewish people, saying that His primary intention in taking their forefathers out of Egypt wasn't the sacrificial offerings, rather in order that they observe the commandments. But despite the fact that G-d repeatedly dispatched prophets to admonish the people, "They did not obey nor did they incline their ear, but walked according to [their] own counsels and in the view of their evil heart, and they went backwards and not forwards." G-d further informs Jeremiah that the people will also not hearken to these words that he will speak to them now.

The *Haftorah* concludes with G-d's admonition: "Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom, nor the strong man boast of his strength, nor the rich man boast of his riches. But let him that boasts exult in this, that he understands and knows me, for I am G-d Who practices kindness, justice and righteousness on the earth; for in these things I delight, says G-d."

## MOVE THAT MOUNTAIN by Shelley Feldheim

Faith, they say it can move mountains, but can mountains move faith? Before today I'd never considered the question. My daughter lives in Jerusalem, and it all started when Rachel's friend Miriam proposed they join a softball league as a way to meet guys. Rachel wasn't sure and called to ask for my opinion. "Of course," I answered, "after all your grandmother was a PE teacher and made "All-County" in women's field hockey and lacrosse. And your great aunt played softball into her sixties. The only reason she stopped was that she broke three fingers sliding into home. And I played little league and Babe Ruth league every season until high school-it's in your blood. YOU MUST-PLAY!"

Rachel said she'd try it out but didn't know how she was getting there. That was before Miriam, a fitness buff, showed up at her apartment with two bicycles. Rachel hasn't ridden a bike since getting into a bike accident on New York's West Side Highway bike path where injuries to her wrist and hand required medical attention. And having grown up in Miami, where the highest point is the pitcher's mound at Florida Marlin's Stadium, she isn't used to climbing or gliding down slopes, especially Jerusalem's hills. Nothing prepared her for this night-time grinding and flying Jerusalem junket. I don't know the details, but Rachel summed up the downhill runs as some of the scariest moments of her life.

Given the person it's coming from this is quite amazing. My twenty-nine year old daughter has maneuvered motor boats over lakes, taxied a private plane along a runway, bathed an elephant while standing knee deep in an Amazon jungle-river, danced barefoot in the fountains of Rome while enduring the taunts of horrified Italians, demanded a hockey player to behave himself after starting a fight, and fallen through a thatched roof while peering at the moon in Vietnam. Curiously, the dizzy up and downhill runs did nothing to compromise Rachel's ability to connect with the ball. She smacked a line drive single into the outfield during her tryout.

"But I don't think I'm going to play." she told me afterward.

"Why not?"

"I'm not taking that frightening bike ride again. In fact, I didn't even ride home; I took the bus back instead and put the bike on the rack."

"What about your roots?"

"You mean grandma and Aunt Lee?"

"Well them too, but I'm referring to our heritage-it's piled with peaks, brimming with bluffs; you can't talk about tradition without mentioning hills and mountains. Noah's ark came to rest on one, Isaac was almost slaughtered on a Sierra, and Moses received the Ten Commandments on a ridge. Mountains are mentioned throughout Tanach because they are symbolic of being higher or closer to the One Above. Besides," I concluded, "you'll certainly meet some eligible bachelors."

"Dad I have faith that I'll meet a great guy even if I don't play softball, after all, He is not consigned to "above," He can be found everywhere." I have to admit my daughter is right, Rachel has seen the Holy One in rivers, fountains, rooftops, hockey arenas and elsewhere, let's face it-He is infinite. But what really moved Rachel to have faith? I think it was that terrifying half hour she spent wheeling up and down Jerusalem's narrow, hilly passageways and survived to talk about it.

So now I know-mountains can move faith!


